1. I-17 COLLABORATION

This city led collaboration provided:

- Multi-Department Partnerships;
 Office of Homeless Solutions, ADOT, Community Bridges, Phoenix PD, Neighborhood Services, City Streets,
- Community Prosecution

 Removal of 6,000 sq. ft of graffiti
- Removal of 12 TONS of trash
- 219 individuals were contacted
- 71 individuals offered services/resources
- 12 accepted services/help
- 141 individuals were arrested

5. COMMUNITY SAFETY PLANS

\$6 Million

A comprehensive, collaborative approach to improve quality of life in focused areas, including 19th Ave, 27th Ave and Hatcher Rd. This Investment brings:

- NEW specialized equipment such as;
 - cameras
 - gun shot detectors
 - licence plate readers
 - real-time crime center
- Additional staff
 - 4 community procecutors, 9 Police Assistants (to operate the real-time center), 1 neighborhood specialist and 1 neighborhood inspector
